## What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small text file that we store on your device when you use our website. It may allow a website "remember" your actions or preferences over a period of time, or it may contain data related to the function or delivery of the site. Cookies can be set by the owner of the website or in some cases by third party services that the website owner allows to present other information, run content or provide other functionality such as analytics. The law states that we can only store cookies on your device if they are strictly necessary for the operation of the website. For all other types of cookies, we need your consent.

## How are cookies used on this site?

This site uses different types of cookies. Some cookies are placed by third party services that appear on our pages.

## Necessary cookies

We use **necessary** cookies to make our site work. Necessary cookies help make a website usable by enabling basic functions like page navigation and access to secure areas of the website. The website cannot function properly without these cookies.

**Preference Cookies** 

Preference cookies enable the website to remember information about you that changes the way the website behaves e.g. your preferred language.

**Statistics Cookies** 

Statistic cookies help website owners to understand how visitors interact with websites by collecting and reporting information anonymously. We use Statistics cookies to analyse anonymised usage patterns.

Marketing Cookies

Marketing cookies are used to track visitors across websites. They are used to display ads relevant for the individual user and, therefore, more valuable for publishers and third-party advertisers.
